WESTCHESTER REPORT CALLS FOR ALL DIVISIONS.

In the south:

There are 63 jobs with 30 or more working electricians. 4- jobs with over 100 men There are 772 currently on furlough.

The market recovery work totals \$84 mil \$76 million for interior fit out work.

\$7.5 mil tel/data work

There are 994 first through 4th year apprentices.

There are 198 ADM members unemployed.

There has been 1 accident since the last meeting:

A member was shocked working in Penn Station splicing 277volts. The injury resulted in a laceration to his bicep and burns on his hands. He is being treated and is expected to recover.

The welfare plan continues to be challenged. There needs to be a solution to the high cost of medical. \$170 million more came out of the welfare plan than went in. Plus an additional \$90 million in cost due to Covid -19 expenses.

The business manager is talking about a state funded plan in New York State for hospitalization that would offer some relief for our medical.

Members with CDL licenses are needed.

Jurisdictional issues at Kennedy airport are ongoing. They are regarding the wiring of generators and past decision have supported that is the work of the electrician and NOT the engineer.

There is talk of affordable housing being built. A PLA would ensure that the work will be done union. We are hopeful that a new Transit project will be done with a PLA.

300 miles of conduit for transmission lines were awarded to the laborers but we will argue that is the work of the electrician.

March is Women's History month.

March is also the month we celebrate St Patrick Day.

March 25, we honor those that died during the Triangle Shirtwaist Factory fire. This tragic fire was the beginning of safety rules for workers everywhere.
